

Death of Mrs. James Boatright.

DIED—Sunday, Jan. 23, 1910, at the home of her son, James Boatright, Mrs. Eveline Boatright, Of old age. She was born in Missouri, March 1st, 1837, being 72 years, 10 months and 22 days of age.

October 22, 1853, she was married to Jesse S. Boatright of Kentucky. On October 22, 1905, they celebrated their golden wedding in Wagoner, Oklahoma, where they lived for about seven years. On November 6th, 1906, he took his departure, leaving her to struggle alone. For some three months she has been bedfast and although willing and loving hands did all they could to relieve her distress, which was intense, no relief came until she found it in death.

When she was quite young she professed religion and later united with the Baptist Church, in which, for more than fifty years of consecrated, christian life and service, she weilded a strong influence for Christ and the Church. Deceased was the the mother of 16 children, 10 of whom survive her. Her three sons are James and George of Wagoner and Jesse of Hominy, Oklahoma. The seven girls are Mesdames J. I. Shipley, D. P. Shipley of Arkanasas; Mrs. Will Ruble and Mrs. John Speith of Wagoner; Mrs. Clem Arnold of McAlester; Mrs. A. J. Parsley, of Washington.

She was conscious up to the last. Saturday, she called the children, six of whom were present, one by one, to her bedside and gave them a personal admontion to meet her in Heaven.

Her death, like her life, left no room for doubt as to the security of her soul. Her dying statement to her children was that she was ready and that there was nothing between her and her God.
